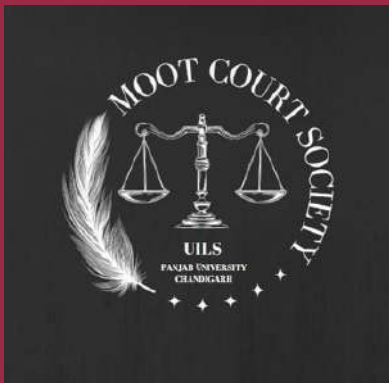

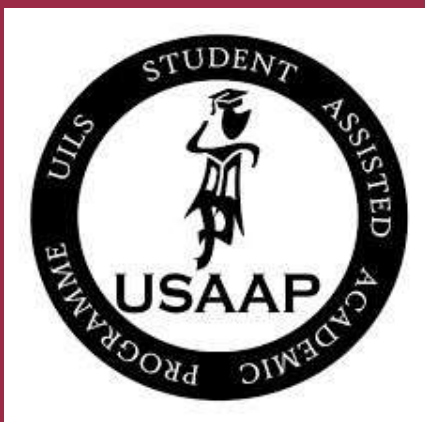

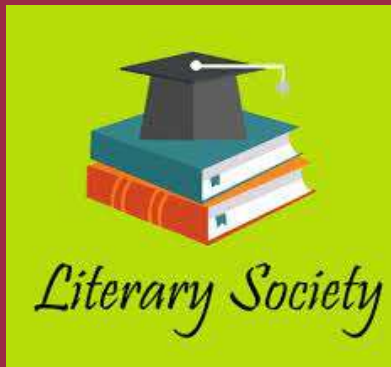

MARKS & EVALUATION

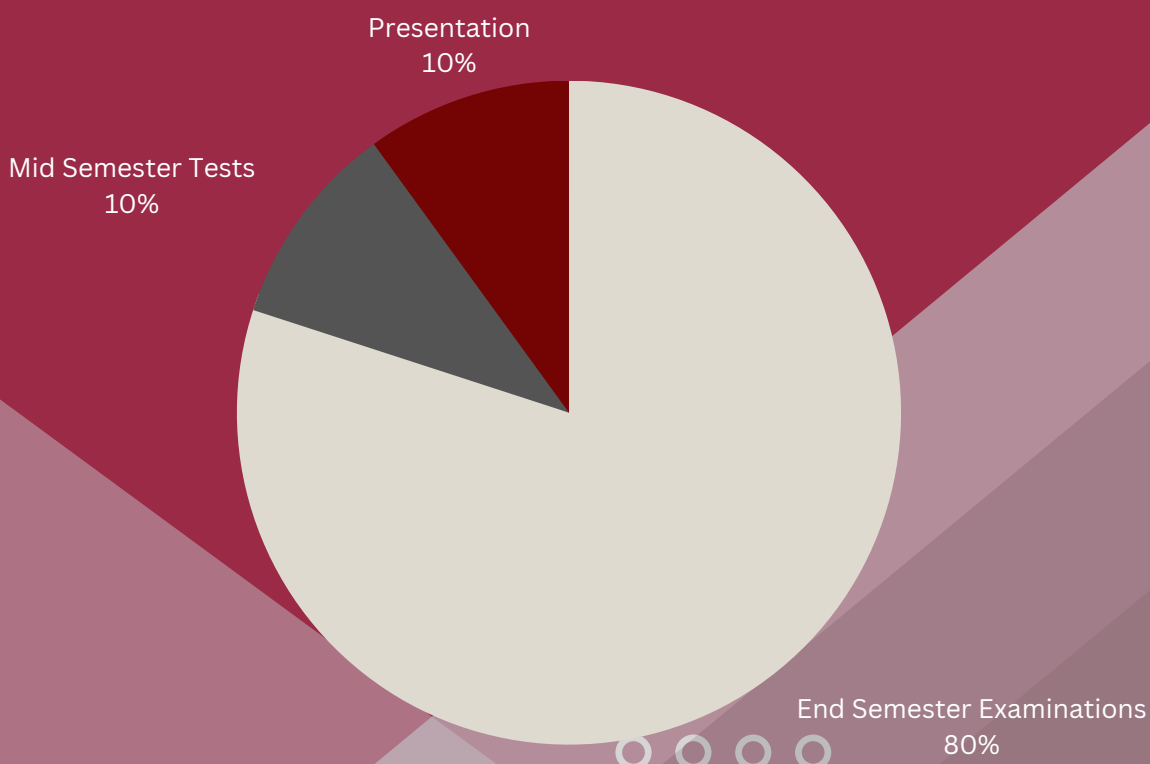
The evaluation system at the UILS, Panjab University comprises of a rigorous system of examinations, project reports, presentations and moot courts.

We have 2 separate streams- B.A.LL.B (Hons.) and B.Com LL.B (Hons). To properly cater to the demands and needs of the profession and the industry separate subjects that mainly focus on the arts and the commerce are taught respectively.

At the end of every semester, each student is marked out of a total of 100 for every subject which factors in their examinations, project reports and presentations, thereby making 600 marks the grand total of the first eight semesters and 500 marks in the last two

Evaluation for both the streams is the same – 80 marks semester end examinations along with 20 marks which consists of 10 marks for project reports and presentations and 10 marks for the Mid Semester Exams which makes a total of 100 marks per subject.

Compulsory Moot Courts, Legal Aid Clinic, internship diary maintenance and attending LokAdalats forms an integral part of evaluation system in the 9th Semester.

UILS RECRUITMENT RULES

Career Development Cell (hereinafter referred to as 'CDC') is the official recruitment body of the institute that is empowered to invite prospective recruiters to the campus of University Institute of Legal Studies, Chandigarh (hereinafter referred to as 'UILS'). CDC has formulated the following procedure to facilitate the recruitment process.

Registration

Organisations intending to participate in the Recruitment Drive can communicate their willingness either by email, fax or post or telephonically to CDC.

Pre Placement Talks

The recruiters may conduct pre-placement talks to interact and ventilate students about crucial principle features of their organisation, job profile, terms and conditions of employment, remuneration and other relevant information. The recruiters are urged to indicate their preferred dates for such talks to CDC either at the time of registration or at least a week prior to their arrival. Taking into consideration the present circumstances, these talks can be held in virtual mode also.

Pre-Interview Screening Process

Pre Interview Screening Process may be conducted any time before the final interviews. Recruiters are free to determine their own policy for the Screening Process to shortlist students. In case the Recruiter has no particular method of Pre Interview Screening, the Curricula Vitae of all interested students shall be forwarded to the Recruiter. In case the Recruiter has no procedure for Pre Interview Screening, the list of interested students shall automatically become the Final Interview List.

Mode of Interview Screening Process

- On campus/ Virtual (depending upon the circumstances)
- Telephonic interview/ Video-conferencing
- Walk-In Interviews at the office of Recruiting firm/lawyer/organisation

Preferred date and time of final interviews shall be communicated to CDC, so that necessary arrangements for the same can be made.

Disclosure of Offers

After the final interviews, recruiters are required to make final offers to shortlisted candidates mentioning the designation, remuneration, location and other relevant terms and conditions required to make a decision. Acopy of offer letter(s) shall also be sent by the recruiter to CDC for records. Acceptance/ Rejection of offer shall be communicated by the concerned student to the recruiter. A copy of such communication shall also be marked to CDC.
